Sand Creek Bike Path

Newton's Sand Creek Bike Path is a paved walking/jogging/biking path that runs along Sand Creek from Athletic Park to Centennial Park. Walking along the bike path is a relaxing and natural experience. Many ducks and geese gather along the banks as community friends exercise or fish. Restrooms are located in Athletic Park, 10th and Ash Park, and at Centennial Park seasonally.

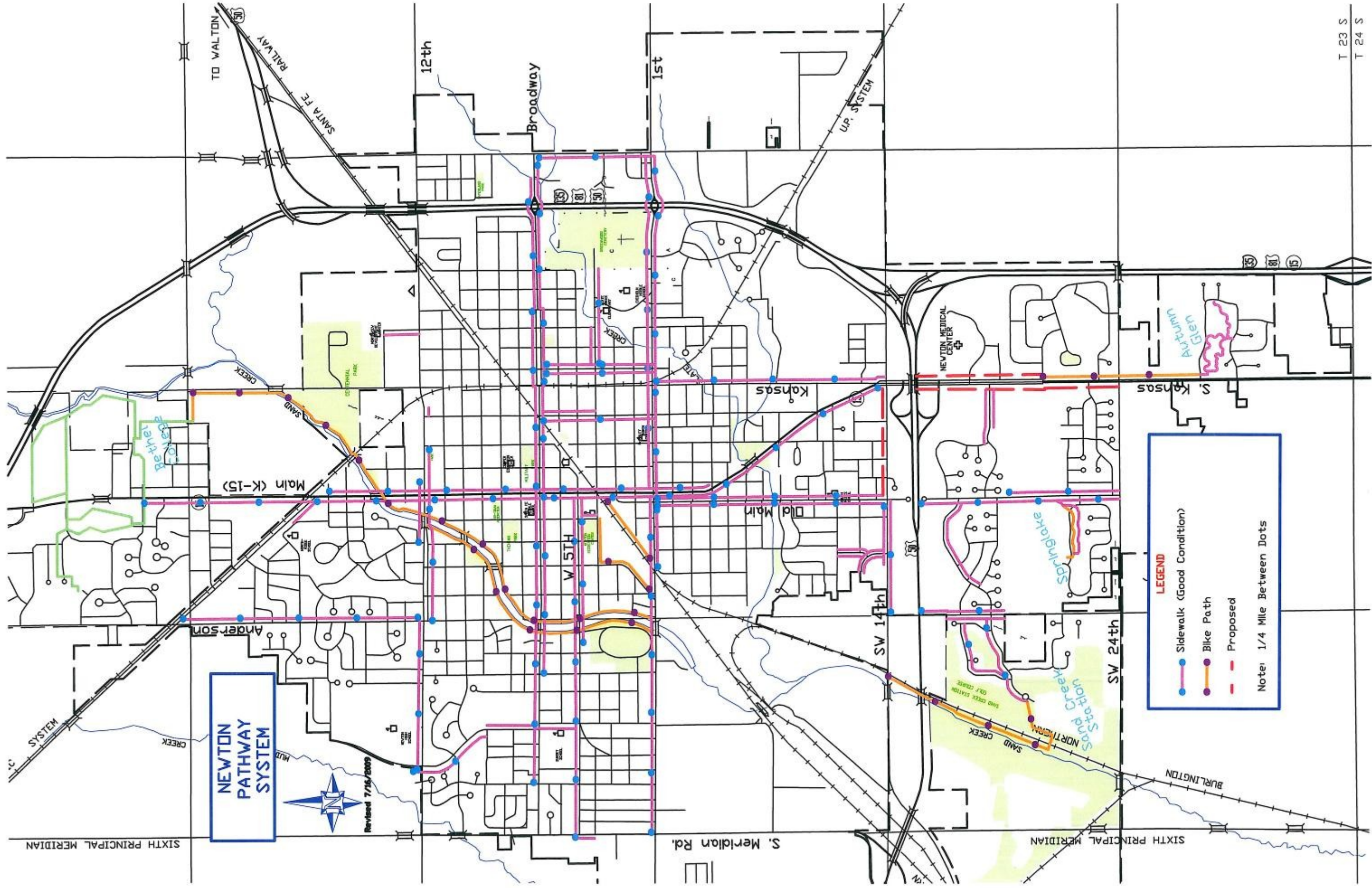
Pause points with benches are provided at various locations along the path. In addition to connecting the bike path to the Bethel College path system, the Trail of Two Cities project also looped the bike path up First Street and along the railway to downtown.

Share the path

- Stay on designated path.
- Keep right so others can pass.
- Keep all pets on leash. Dispose of pet waste.
- Obey traffic signs and rules.
- Dispose of all garbage and litter.
- Do not feed the waterfowl along the creek.
- Respect the adjoining landowners' rights and privacy.
- Warn other path users when passing by giving an audible signal.
- Enjoy the beauty of wild plants and animals, but leave them undisturbed for all to enjoy.
